

WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE



Look for an escape route.
Always follow the instructions of the authorities and comply with municipal fire prevention regulations



Take refuge on the beach.
If you are on the beach, gather on the sand and immerse yourself in shallow water: this is the safest place



Do not retrieve vehicles.
Do not attempt to retrieve cars, motorcycles, etc., or anything left inside them



Avoid dangerous areas.
Do not stay in places above the fire or in areas towards which the smoke is heading



Clear the roads.
Facilitate the intervention of emergency vehicles by clearing the roads and not obstructing them with your car

Best practices for forest fire protection and prevention



FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY



Let's protect our Natural Heritage.

In recent years, rising temperatures and water shortages have caused prolonged drought, making plants more susceptible to fire. Forest fires pose a serious threat to the environmental heritage of La Maddalena Park, so it is essential to behave correctly and responsibly, in order to prevent fires from starting and spreading.

Reference Regulations

Pursuant to Article 11 of Law 394/91, 'Framework Law on Protected Areas', open fires are prohibited in parks. Violation of this rule is punishable by law as a criminal offence.

PREVENTIVE BEHAVIOUR IN NATURAL AREAS

In general, it is forbidden to carry out actions that, due to weather conditions, the state of the vegetation and the dangerous nature of the tools, equipment and instruments used, could cause a forest fire.

In particular, please note that it is

FORBIDDEN TO:

Throwing from vehicles, or otherwise leaving on the ground, matches, cigars or cigarettes and any other type of material that is lit, smouldering, or that in any case could start or spread a fire

Using any type of fireworks without authorization



Using tools, equipment and instruments that may cause sparks and contribute to the outbreak of a fire, as referred to in Article 2 of Law 353/2000



Parking cars outside authorized parking areas, as exhaust pipes can **exceed 300°C and cause a fire.**



Leaving rubbish in the woods. **Dispose of it in the appropriate bins** or take it home with you



Within wooded areas, do not use stoves, ovens or incinerators that produce sparks or embers.



GOOD PREVENTION PRACTICES



When you spot a fire, immediately call the competent authorities by dialling the toll-free number
1515 (Corpo Forestale) o 115 (Vigili del Fuoco)



Always follow the instructions of the authorities and comply with municipal fire prevention regulations



Do not stop or pass through areas where firefighting operations are in progress



Keep the areas around your property clean by removing dry vegetation and flammable materials



Immediately report suspicious or dangerous behaviour to the competent authorities



Check the weather conditions and fire risk level before visiting natural areas



Actively collaborate with fire prevention awareness campaigns
